



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Initially drifting snow will lead to unstable windslab accumulations developing on North-West to North-East aspects above 800 metres, corrie rims and gully tops will be especially affected. As it turns milder wet snow instabilities will develop on steep North-West through North to Easterly aspects mainly above 800 metres. On these aspects cornices will become increasingly unstable and could potentially trigger slopes below. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight Southerly winds will steadily increase, becoming strong to gale force during the day. A dry night followed by the arrival of light snow, this will turn to light sleet and rain at all levels by the afternoon. Overnight the 900 metre freezing level will rise to well above the summits and remain so for the duration of the day.

Comments

Rock and ice fall a potential hazard during the milder temperatures.
