



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 18/01/2022

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected. The snowpack will remain firm and well bonded at all elevations. Some softening of the snow surface will occur where slopes are exposed to solar radiation below 950 metres. Greatest amounts are on North-West through North to East aspects above 950 metres, such as steep coire back walls and ridge flanks. Below this altitude the snow cover is very patchy. A light dusting of snow later above 1100 metres will be insignificant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A predominately dry day is expected with some very light precipitation at the end of the forecast period. This will fall as snow above 1100 metres although amounts are expected to be insignificant. The wind will be strong, increasing steadily to gale force and from the South-South-West. The freezing level will be around 950 metres.

Comments

Very firm snow ice (neve), on steep slopes with serious consequences in the event of an unchecked slide or fall.
