

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Overnight, the existing patchy snowpack will continue to thaw, remaining consolidated and stable. Through the day, it will refreeze and further consolidate. There will be a dusting of new snow, initially at summit level, lowering to 400 metres in the afternoon. New snow amounts will be small, mostly accumulating in sheltered high East to South aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Patchy overnight rain at all levels will turn to light wintry showers by early morning as the freezing level lowers from above the summits overnight to 400 metres by the end of the period. The strong South-West wind will veer North West overnight, easing to fresh through the day.

**Comments**

A brief return to winter conditions. There will be a significant windchill on the summits.
