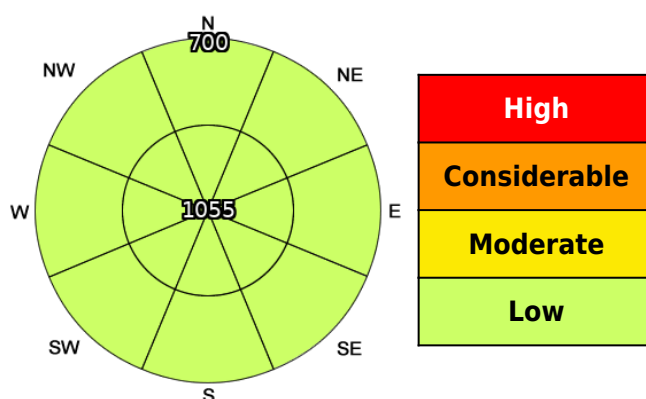


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 24/01/2022****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The few remaining snow patches will continue to gradually thaw. These snow patches will be well consolidated and stable and will mainly be located around coire rims and in gullies on North to East aspects above 850 metres. Any summit snow amounts in the afternoon are not expected to be significant. Most locations will mainly have bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will be a cloudy day with drizzle and some light rain showers, heaviest in the morning. Showers may turn to snow on the highest summits as the freezing level drops during the afternoon. The freezing level will be just above the summits dropping to around 1000 metres during the afternoon. Strong South-Westerly winds overnight will decrease in strength and become light North-Westerly during the morning.

Comments

Remaining mild for the time of year for the next few days, snow showers only possible on the highest summits.
