



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 25/01/2022

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected. The existing patchy snowpack will remain firm, well bonded and stable. Greatest amounts are located on coire back walls, scarp slopes and ridge flanks of a North-West through North to East aspect above 950 metres. Isolated patches at lower elevations will become increasingly depleted in the slow thaw. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry day is expected. Winds will be South-Westerly moderate, building gradually to become strong later. The freezing level will be at summit level overnight before dropping to around 1100 metres during daylight hours.

Comments

The hazard of firm snow ice remains, despite a gradual softening of the snow surface. An unchecked slide or fall will most likely have serious consequences.
