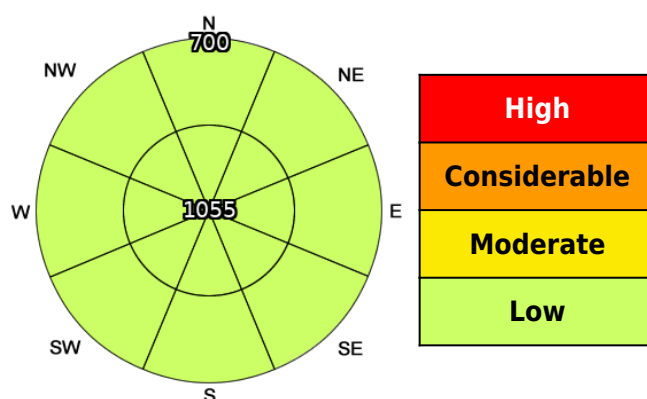


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 26/01/2022****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Little change expected. The few snow patches that exist will be well consolidated and stable throughout and will continue to slowly thaw, although they will be firm around higher summits, particularly through the morning. Most snow patches remain on steep North to East aspects, The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Hill fog and drizzle will persist overnight and through the morning followed by rain at all levels in the afternoon, heavy at times. Fresh to strong West-South-West winds will become gale force in the afternoon on exposed summits. The freezing level will rise from summit level overnight to well above the summits by daybreak.

Comments

Remaining unsettled leading up to the weekend, with strong winds and no significant snowfall expected.
